The Unity's voyage from Zeeland to Western Africa lasted well over two months. First The Unity sailed to the Upper Coast, then to the Ivory Coast and finally to the Gold Coast. The captain and first mate traded as much cargo for slaves, water and rice as possible. Per trade location the demand for goods and the supply enslaved Africans varied. Men were more expensive than women and boys were more expensive than girls. Gold and ivory were bought in addition to slaves.

The Zeelanders shipped a total of 270.000 slaves, 90.000 enslaved Africans did not survive the voyage.


