Own interpretation. Background information: This image is from the book: 'Narrative of a five years' expedition against the revolted Negroes of Surinam' by John Gabriël Stedman. The desciption by the image is: "John Gabriël Stedman stands over a slave after the capture of Gado Saby, from the frontispiece of his Narrative". The image is on the title page of his book. Stedman (1744-1797) was a Scottish-Dutch soldier, later captain, in the Dutch military. He helped suppress a slave revolt in Surinam. Stedman fell in love with a female slave and tried to purchase her freedom. About his experiences he wrote a book, which appeared in English in 1796 and in Dutch a few years later.
